

Pupil Premium 2016-17

The pupil premium is additional funding (£1320 per child) given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. There is also funding (£1900 per child) given for children who are looked after, have been adopted from care or who have left care.

For the financial year 2016/17 the Federation has been allocated £132,420. You can see below the range of activities we have used and continue to use this funding for. These activities help to ensure that our children in receipt of Pupil Premium achieve their full potential:

- Grammar support
- Reading/ writing support
- Maths support
- Achievement school
- Shine
- Additional teachers for streaming groups
- Additional teachers for intervention groups
- Subsidised provision for holiday schemes
- Subsidised provision for school journey
- Subsidised provision for school trips
- Subsidised West End Theatre visit
- Theatre groups visits to lead workshops with Pupil Premium children
- Subsidised London duck tours
- Subsidised science workshops for all Pupil Premium children
